Application

This unit involves the skills and knowledge required to drive a light rigid vehicle safely in accordance with relevant state/territory road and traffic authority licence requirements and regulations for light vehicles.

It includes consistently and efficiently controlling vehicle functions, monitoring traffic and road conditions, managing vehicle operating condition and performance, and effectively managing hazardous situations, according to workplace procedures.

Driving is performed under supervision until competent, and with duty of care responsibility for self and others in achieving the prescribed outcomes.

The primary legislative requirements applicable to this unit of competency are state/territory legislation in relation to road use and driver licensing.

This unit does not provide a licence outcome.

To achieve a licence candidates should complete the TLI Licence to drive a light rigid vehicle and check with the state/territory driver licensing authority for eligibility, including licence tenure, driving experience and medical fitness requirements.

Evidence required to demonstrate competence in this unit must be relevant to and satisfy all the requirements of the elements and performance criteria and include:

- applying precautions and required action to minimise, control or eliminate identified hazards
- carrying out pre-start checks on vehicle, according to manufacture instructions and workplace procedures
- completing relevant documentation
- demonstrating low risk driving behaviours
- load is safely and effectively restrained according to National Load Restraint Guidelines and workplace procedures
- modifying driving activities depending on operational contingencies, risk situations and environments
- applying route planning and navigation techniques
- monitoring and anticipating traffic hazards and taking actions
- monitoring performance of vehicle and its equipment, and taking action, as required
- reading and interpreting relevant instructions, procedures, information and road signs
- reporting and/or rectifying identified problems, faults or light rigid vehicle malfunctions promptly in accordance with regulatory requirements and workplace procedures.

- factors that increase fatigue-related accidents
- causes and effects of fatigue on drivers

- lifestyles that promote effective long-term fatigue management
- relevant work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) and environmental procedures and regulations
- differences between transmission types
- driving hazards and related defensive driving techniques
- efficient driving techniques
- engine power management strategies
- factors that may cause traffic delays and diversions and related actions that can be taken by the driver

- light rigid vehicle controls, instruments and indicators and their use
- light rigid vehicle handling procedure
- navigation techniques and associated technology
- pre-start checks carried out on vehicle and related actions according to workplace procedures
- principles of stress management when driving a light rigid vehicle
- procedures to be followed in a driving emergency
- relevant state/territory road and traffic authority road rules, regulations, permits and licence requirements
- workplace driving and operational instructions

Assessment Conditions

Assessment must occur in workplace operational situations in a vehicle typical of that used in industry and on a variety of road conditions.

Assessment processes and techniques must be appropriate to the language, literacy and numeracy requirements of the work being performed and the needs of the candidate.

Resources for assessment must include:

- a suitable light rigid vehicle that meets relevant state/territory compliance
- a load and load restraint equipment that meet any relevant jurisdictional requirements for assessment
- a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or simulations
- relevant materials, tools, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry
- applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals
